

Visit of Mr. Amuda Baba to UK June 2014

1. CAHRD CONSULTATION

Mr. AMUDA BABA arrived in Liverpool on 11th June 2014, to attend the 2014 Collaboration for Applied Health Research & Delivery (CAHRD) Consultation which took place in Liverpool from the 12th to the 13th June 2014. The consultation was on developing policies - improving practices - transforming systems: "The 10-20 year horizon". Mr. Amuda gave a presentation on the second day, where he talked about "Introducing the issues in the health systems stream from an IPASC perspective", in emerging health systems and community interfaces theme.



The second day of the consultation, Mr. Amuda, with 9 other people from Africa (Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda and Malawi), Asia (Bangladesh, India) and UK took place in Question Time panel, moderated by Mr. Peter Sissons.

From June 18th to June 20th, Mr. Amuda took place in a workshop on supporting community health workers. The workshop covered: reviews of findings from the country case studies, synthesis of the country case studies and findings from CHW literature reviews and other related issues.
